Pre-Reading Activities

1. Building Background Knowledge

- Family Structures Discussion
 - Create a mind map of different types of families
 - Discuss what makes a family
 - Introduce basic foster care/adoption concepts

2. Science Fiction Elements

- Genre Exploration
 - Brainstorm characteristics of science fiction
 - Discuss favorite sci-fi stories
 - Create Venn diagrams comparing reality and science fiction

3. Cultural Connections

- Global Awareness
 - Locate India and Scotland on a map
 - Introduce basic cultural elements from both countries
 - Discuss the role of storytelling in different cultures

Chapter-by-Chapter Teaching Guide

Chapters 1-2: Introduction

Focus: Introduction to characters and setting

Activities:

- Create character profiles
- Draw the MacIver house/neighborhood
- Start a prediction journal

Discussion Questions:

- Why might the aliens choose the MacIvers?
- How do the different children adapt to their new family?
- What makes Fritter special to Allen?

Chapters 3-4: Mystery Development

Focus: Mystery development and character relationships

Activities:

- Create a map of the woods
- Write journal entries from different perspectives
- Chart each child's mysterious encounter

Writing Prompt: > "Write about a time when you saw something you couldn't explain."

Chapters 5-6: Trust & Teamwork

Focus: Trust and teamwork

Activities:

- Design Allen's new wheelchair
- Role-play family discussions
- Create a timeline of events

STEM Connection: > Explore adaptive technology and accessibility concepts

Chapters 7-8: Cultural Identity

Focus: Cultural identity and choices

Activities:

- Analyze Amar's grandfather's stories
- Create comparison charts for different characters' choices
- Write alternative scenarios

- Design "wanted" posters for the Loma
- Write diary entries from Antonia's perspective
